

## Considering History and Pre-law?

History majors have traditionally scored very well on the LSAT exam and combining pre-law with a history degree will give you more choices in elective courses than any other degree program. The following is a sample course of study that meets both the pre-law advising requirements and the major. Italicized courses denote pre-law requirements.
