

The Human Services Major – Sample Course of Study

Introduction to the Discipline

USCB's baccalaureate in Human Services program prepares students for employment or advanced study in the art and science of care. As a growing field of study emerging in response to an increasingly sophisticated global economy, this liberal arts interdisciplinary degree produces students with attitudes, values, knowledge and skills to make a positive difference in the helping professions. In addition to Human Services courses, the program draws from the disciplines of sociology and psychology and is guided by the principles of the National Council on Standards for Human Services Education. It also provides a series of internships so that students gain the ability to apply the knowledge and skills learned through their coursework.
