USCB Minors and Liberal Studies Minors:

Liberal Studies requires 18 hours of upper-division coursework in a single discipline *unless* one of the following minors is selected, in which case the requirements specified below apply. These are the minors currently offered by individual departments at USCB.

Anthropology: BANT 101 and 102 and four additional courses at the 300+ level.

Art History: BARH 105 and 106 and four additional courses with a "C" or better

Art Studio: 18 hours, including BATS 105 and/or 106; BARH 105 or 106; 200 level or above studio coursework in at least one of drawing, painting, or printmaking.

English Minor in Literature: BENG 287, 288 or 289 and 300+level courses in pre-1800 literature (2 courses), post-1800 literature (2 courses), and additional courses in English (2 courses).

English Minor in Writing. BENG 287, 288 or 289 and three courses from BENG 460,462, 463, 465, and three additional 300+ level courses in English.

Hospitality Management: BHRM 110, 260, and 280, and three additional courses, at least two of which must be at the 300 level or above.

Psychology: BPSY 101 and three courses from BPSY 400, 410, 420,b 430, 440, 450, 460, and two courses numbered 200 or above (one course only of which may include BPSY 399, 498, 598, or 599).

Spanish: BSPA 122, 209, 210, 309 and two additional courses at the 300+ level.
