## OLLI FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### WHAT IS OLLI?

OLLI is the acronym for the prestigious Osher Lifelong Learning Institute offered at 125 Universities throughout the country. OLLI provides intellectual, social, and cultural enrichment opportunities in a climate that fosters friendship and a mutual sharing of ideas and life experiences.

### MISSION

The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at the University of South Carolina Beaufort (USCB) is devoted to creating and sustaining a robust and thriving lifelong learning community specifically developed for adults 50 and older through intellectual and social programs.

### WHY JOIN OLLI?

People who are active, engaged in their communities, and who continue learning throughout their lives feel more productive and purposeful, and are healthier and happier. Members share common bonds of intellectual curiosity and the experience of their generation. They are self-motivated learners, eager to share opinions, knowledge, and expertise with humor and mutual respect. OLLI offers opportunities to meet new friends, make contacts, and develop connections. In addition to lectures, members can attend social events, take field trips, and participate in a myriad of other short courses that better one's quality of life, providing a personal sense of health, engagement, and overall well-being.

### WHO TEACHES THE COURSES?

OLLI's philosophy is "teach your passion." Our volunteer instructors are fellow lifelong learners, just like you. They may teach topics related to those they pursued before retirement or may share their knowledge in a new area of interest.

### HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

OLLI memberships are \$45 annually. Membership grants you access to all OLLI programs across our three regions. There are three terms within a year, Winter/Spring, Summer, and Fall. Members can choose between an UNLIMITED or PAYGO option. Unlimited allows a member to take as many classes within that term as they wish for just \$125. PAYGO allows members to pay per class for just \$15. Summer classes are FREE for OLLI members.

# OLLI Glossary of Terms

**FIRST SERVED REGISTRATION:** A program filled by members who register first.

**IN-PERSON:** Physical attendance in a USCB OLLI classroom in Beaufort, Bluffton and Hilton Head Island.

**LIMITED ENROLLMENT:** Limited number of attendees based on instructor preference or location.

**LIVESTREAM:** Live transmission of a class between OLLI regions.

**OFFSITE:** Class/tour/trip not on campus but at an offsite location.

**OLLI DIGITAL LIBRARY (ODL):** Access to previously recorded classes on a video library via the internet anytime.

**OSHER ONLINE:** Additional learning opportunity via ZOOM run by the Osher National Resource Center in Chicago (additional fees apply) for USCB OLLI members.

**PAYGO:** Pay for each class separately upon registration.

**RANDOM DRAW:** The registration method for selected limited enrollment classes. Anyone can register until a certain date and then a random drawing, via computer software, to select participants. Those not selected go on the waitlist.

**UNLIMITED:** Pay one price that allows you to take as many USCB OLLI courses within the term.

**ZOOM:** Live class viewed via Zoom on a device with internet.

## ART100: ANDREW WYETH THE ENCHANTED REALIST

**NEW**

Revered by the public and berated by art critics, Andrew Wyeth was one of the most popular and controversial American artists of the 20th century. The spare, flinty, realism of his paintings, their limited palette of colors, the haunting, at times eerie portraits of his neighbors in Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania depicted rural life in ways that viewers found profoundly interesting and emotionally and psychologically evocative. This presentation will begin with a deep dive into his iconic painting, *Christina's World*, followed by a class discussion on some of the most defining works of Wyeth's long career.



**RON ROTH** is the former Director and CEO of the Reading Public Museum in Reading, Pennsylvania, and director of the Nebraska Museum of Art of the University of Nebraska. He has curated numerous exhibitions including the "Patriotic Paintings of N.C. Wyeth" and a major exhibition featuring international glass artist Dale Chihuly.

Art Deco and Art Moderne are two terms that are frequently used interchangeably, especially when referring to architecture. Come to learn why this is not accurate! Art Deco was a style of the late 1920s. It was marked by warm colors and angular lines. Following the 1929 crash, businesses needed to "style" their products to look "modern" to encourage people to spend what little money they had. Designers turned to the airplanes and zeppelins of the period as inspiration for being "modern." Art Moderne was the result: curved, streamlined forms with cool color palettes.



**GERALD LARSON** (Master of Architecture at the University of Michigan) is a Professor Emeritus of Architecture at the University of Cincinnati, where he taught architecture and architectural history for over 40 years.

## COI104: COMMUNITY GROWTH MANAGEMENT - THE BASICS

Looking at a map in the Lowcountry, you may notice that the boundaries defining some towns have sprawled over very large areas, creating odd shapes and often leaving "holes" throughout the community that are still part of the "unincorporated county." How and where a municipality or county grows and makes decisions on land development can be perplexing but there are some basic ingredients to ensure thriving communities and the protection of natural resources into the future. ## HIS102: THE CIVIL WAR: WHY DID SO MANY DIE?

The consequences shaped the American Revolution to come.



**MARK SUMMERS** works as Director of Youth Public Programs at Preservation Virginia, a private non-profit organization and statewide historic preservation leader. Mark graduated from the University of Mississippi and is currently based in Jamestown, Virginia.

Learn a short history of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team, made up of volunteers that formed the segregated Japanese-American army combat unit. Ultimately 2,686 from Hawaii and 1,500 from mainland U.S. internment camps assembled at Camp Shelby, Mississippi in April 1943 for a year of infantry training. Many soldiers from the continental U.S. had families in internment camps in the USA while they fought abroad. The unit's motto was "Go for Broke".

**COL (Ret) LAWRENCE SAUL** bio in next column



**COL (Ret) LAWRENCE SAUL** served more than 37 years in the U.S. Army, with more than 20 of those years overseas. He was one of the last Vietnam veterans still on active duty when he retired in 2008. He has taught more than 100 military history courses for four different OLLI programs. He served as a United States Civil Service Commissioner, President of the Police Commission of New York City, Assistant Secretary of the United States Navy, Colonel of the 1st United States Volunteer Cavalry, Governor of New York, VP and President of the United States, all by the age of 42. During his Presidency, he declared some 230 million acres of national parks, national forests, wildlife refuges, and national monuments.

## SCI100: WHILE I BREATHE, I HOPE: HERITAGE AT RISK IN SOUTH CAROLINA

Globally, coastal researchers are documenting increasingly severe rates of climate-driven processes that are actively impacting, even erasing, archaeological records. It is predicted that over 20,000 known cultural (archaeological) sites in the Southeastern United States will be destroyed in the next 100 years with a 1-meter rise in sea level. But what should and can we do about this predicted loss of cultural heritage? Since early 2021, SCDNR archaeologist Meg Gaillard has collaborated with other researchers to investigate and monitor impacts on SCDNR coastal properties to establish best practices for future, long-term community science monitoring efforts. Learn about the research and how you can get involved.



**MEG GAILLARD** is an archaeologist with the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR) Heritage Trust Program, co-founder of the South Carolina Archaeology Public Outreach Division (SCAPOD), and co-founder of the North American Heritage at Risk (NAHAR) research collective. She has B.A. degrees in Journalism and Anthropology, an M.A. in Visual Anthropology, and is a part-time Archaeology Ph.D. researcher.

## TECH103: AN INTRODUCTION TO ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND THE PHILOSOPHICAL-ETHICAL QUESTIONS IT RAISES

Interest in Artificial Intelligence (AI) has reached a fever pitch, spurred in part by emerging capabilities such as self-driving taxis and ChatGPT. This session will review the approaches to AI that dominated the first 50 years of this 75-year-old field: computer simulations of forms of human reasoning. Examples include means-end analysis for optimal route planning and model-based reasoning for spacecraft reconfiguration. The class will examine the more recently emphasized neural network-based approaches to AI. These depend on the use of specialized computer architectures that some view as simple analogs to the human brain. Examples include autopilot systems for self-driving cars and generative systems to produce original compositions (Chat GPT), computer code, art, etc. Lastly, the class will explore the moral, social, and existential implications of AI.



**JACK HANSEN, Ph.D.** spent most of his career helping lead research organizations in the federal government (e.g., NASA) and universities (e.g., Penn State Applied Research Laboratory). Since retiring, he has written two books on the personal dimensions of retirement and worked with the OLLI National Resource Center on surveys of OLLI participants. He is also active in the OLLI at Furman University.
