

University of South Carolina Beaufort's Karina Julia Dorris (graduate of Bluffton High School), was selected by the University of South Carolina-Columbia TRIO Department to become a Ronald E. McNair Scholar. Dorris is from Bluffton, SC and graduated from Bluffton High in 2021. She will graduate from USCB in 2025 with a B.S.N. in Nursing. Dorris is a 2021 Heritage Classic Foundation Scholar, a Kathleen and Jim Jordan Annual Scholarship recipient, and Beaufort College Honors student who lives in USCB's student residences on the Beaufort campus. She is involved in the USCB Student Advisory Council, USCB Honors Student Association, Society for Collegiate Leadership & Achievement (SCLA), National Association of Hispanic Nurses (NAHN), National Student Nurses' Association (NSNA), Gamma Beta Phi, Little People of America Association, The National Society of Leadership and Success, and the USCB Student Nurses Association (SNA). She is also part of USCB's Lab For Early Affective Development (LEAD) research group. McNair projects provide opportunities for research or other scholarly activities; summer internships; seminars and other educational activities designed to prepare students for doctoral study; tutoring; academic counseling; and activities designed to assist students participating in the project in securing admission to and financial assistance for enrollment in graduate programs.

USCB Freshman Piper Davis Awarded Prestigious Department of Energy Internship



Piper Davis (graduate of Silver Bluff High School), a USCB freshman in the Beaufort College Honors program, awarded the U.S. Department of Energy's Science Undergraduate Laboratory Internship (SULI) at the Savannah River National Laboratory for the summer 2022 term. Davis will be participating in a project titled "Carbon and Water Dynamics". The project will study CO2 in vegetation at the Savannah River Site and monitor meteorology and water and carbon fluxes to determine how the fluxes are affected by weather events.

USCB Student Richard Bennett Selected as 2022 Newman Civic Fellow

The Newman Civic Fellowship recognizes students who stand out for their commitment to creating positive change in communities locally and around the world. The fellowship named for the late Frank Newman, one of Campus Compact's founders, who was a tireless ad-



vocate for civic engagement in higher education. Bennett, who is a first-generation college student, is a tireless advocate for children and under-resourced adults in his community. He has assisted with HIV/AIDS education, purchased and delivered holiday meals and care packages for the homeless, and volunteered in homeless shelters. Presently, he writes and publishes self-help books to help people be the best version of themselves, and facilitates community meetings to provide support and accountability. As a continuation of his work as a mentor for students at a local high school, he is developing and implementing a parenting program to help families with young people who are growing up in single-parent households.


